## LOCAL STRATEGIES

The main activity will be a film prepared for the support of the candidates about women's role and qualities in politics.

The film will:

- show examples of good practice in smaller cities and villages where the mayors are women who without a big budget are able to help the community just simply with their natural management skills and practical approach to problems and people's desires and needs
- compare these mayor women with the image of a big boss politicians in the big parliament
- mention situation of women in the states such as Norway and Sweden (Will show pictures of various governments e.g. Sweden (13 women and 11 men in the year 2010) and compare it with the situation of some (mainly Muslim) countries where women are absent in politics.
- show statistics about men and women differently behaving in public
- mention successful women in Slovakia
- recall a conflict between the Slovak president and the lady prime minister – telling her: “do not stand in my way!” and test people's reaction to it
- play several well-known slogans on women in politics
- listen to people's ideas and feelings on a street
- and do our best to manage to be witty and persuading

2. This film will be given to every of the 12 candidates in various political parties upon a training about women human rights and women's agenda in their political programs and in various cities (according to their desires) there will be a film show organized with a press conference after where the candidates could present their program and ask for support of the voters.
